**A. RULES AND GUIDELINES FOR ENTRIES**

1. Indigenous students from Siksika Nation in grades 7-9 are invited to **WRITE AN ESSAY** related to an Indigenous hero of your choice who has made a lifetime contribution (posthumous).

**2. How to enter the Essay Contest:**

- a. Choose **one** indigenous hero who shaped life in Alberta;
- b. Research the background, accomplishments and impact of the individual;
- c. You can research through print resources or interview an elder or traditional knowledge keeper and list your references;
- d. Write an essay (**from 400-800 words**). The essay must address each of the three categories below:
  - Describe this individual’s contributions and incorporate the role the champion played in Alberta’s past and how they stood out as a leader of Indigenous people;
  - Show how the champion’s actions supported the community and were important to shaping present day life in southern Alberta.
  - Describe how this individual has inspired you to pursue leadership, citizenship, strive for excellence, volunteer and/or work to “be a hero” in our community today and in the future.

## B. SUBMITTING YOUR ENTRY

1. Use Word format, not pdf for your essay.
2. Fill in the entry form from the website. [www.albertachampions.org](http://www.albertachampions.org)
3. Submit the completed entry form and the essay in digital format to [info@albertachampions.org](mailto:info@albertachampions.org)
4. Submit your entry by April 19, 2018.

## C. JUDGING (rubric available)

Judging of contest entries will be conducted by a committee with a view to measuring

- That the essay includes comprehensive background about the hero, how they stood out as a leader, and how their contribution has impacted our community;
- That the student includes a personal interpretation of how they were inspired by the hero;
- Composition (grammar, spelling, etc.);
- Tone-as a writer, the student has adopted a respectful and appropriate tone.

## D. PRIZES

Essay Contest Prizes
<b>First Prize</b> \$300 certificate to Chinook Centre, a medal and certificate in recognition of your achievement
<b>Second Prize</b> -\$200certificate to Apple Store, a medal and certificate in recognition of your achievement
<b>Third Prize:</b> \$150 certificate to Best Buy, a medal and certificate in recognition of your achievement
<b>Fourth Prize:</b> \$75 certificate to Best Buy, a medal and certificate in recognition of your achievement

### TEACHER OF EACH WINNING STUDENT WILL RECEIVE A CERTIFICATE FOR \$200 TO CHAPTERS INDIGO

- Winners will be notified by **May 25, 2018**.
- The winning students will be invited to have their work displayed, recognized and honoured in the community.
- Decisions of the contest judges are final. Prizes must be accepted as awarded and no substitutions will be available.
