Oliver Bowen was born on December 21, 1942 in Amber Valley, Alberta. He was born to Eva and Obadiah Bowen. He had two sisters, Norma and Shirley Bowen, and two brothers, Lois and Dennis Bowen. Amber Valley was a settlement created by black people. These people were trying to escape the Tulsa Massacre, so they created a settlement 170 km north of Edmonton. He moved to Calgary to work in the public transit department in the same year. Oliver was tasked with designing the CTrain, a line of trains that went throughout Calgary. The system started service in 1981. We still use the system today. The CTrain currently has two routes, known as the Red and Blue lines, with a third line being built in the future. After working with the City of Calgary for 12 years, he became the manager of the light rail transit division.

Oliver Bowen, after accomplishing many things in his life, died on January 1, 2000. Oliver was so successful, the City of Calgary decided to name a light rail transit maintenance facility in his honour, named the Oliver Bowen Maintenance Facility. Oliver Bowen definitely earned this honour. Many people work at the maintenance facility right now. The building is a storage, a Light Rail Transit(LRT) repair shop, and a bus repair shop that works for Calgary Transit.

Oliver Bowen connects to me in many ways. One of them is because he experienced many hardships, but he still managed to be successful in life. He is one of the most successful black engineers to live in and be born in Alberta. Black people were disregarded at the time, so it was very difficult for him to make it in life.
